The challenge: Take a photo of you enjoying your Summer Reading books.

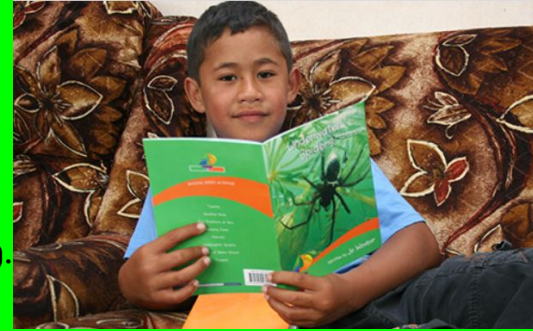
Your photo could be of you reading:

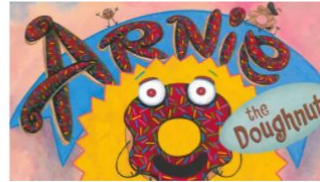
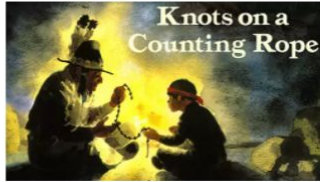

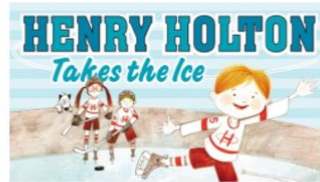
